Early Bird Registration pricing will be in effect from June 1-June 30.

1. All registrations will require you to have the player's HCR (Hockey Canada Registry) number. (See below for obtaining an HCR number.)
2. All Registrations will be required to upload a copy of the Player's Birth Certificate or Passport
3. If the player is new to hockey or transferring from another organization, please fill out the [Intent to Register with EFHA form](#)
4. If the player played with EFHA last season and resides in Edmonton, please use the online link that opens on June 1, 2025
5. If the player played with EFHA last season and resides outside of Edmonton please fill out the [Intent to Register with EFHA form](#)

What is my child's Hockey Canada (HCR) ID number & how do I find it?

NEW to Hockey:

Registering for any Edmonton Female Hockey Alliance program requires a **Hockey Canada Identification Number**.

You will receive this number after you complete the "[Respect In Sport - Parent Edition \(RIS\)](#)"

If you have already completed *Respect In Sport* in another sport, you must transfer your certificate to EFHA. Once this is complete, you will receive a Hockey Canada ID number. [Learn more.](#)

Respect In Sport:

- There is a fee for this course, and it takes about an hour to complete.
- This course expires after 4 years.
- Families that do not have this course will be unable to register online.
- Please ensure you select Edmonton Female Hockey Alliance as your home association. If you have completed Respect In Sport in another sport or for another child, you can transfer your certificate to EFHA. [Learn more.](#)
- This process will generate a Hockey Canada Registry. This is a unique player number that will stay with players throughout their time in Hockey.

Returning Players:

You can find your Hockey Canada number in your [Spordle Account](#) (Hockey Canada Registry) account.

Your Hockey information is hosted within Spordle. If you have been registered in hockey before as a player, coach, manager, trainer, and/or official, here is how to find your HOCKEY Canada ID#:

- Step 1: Log in to your Spordle account.
- Step 2: Click the profile icon in the top right corner.
- Step 3: On the left side of the page, select **"Members"**
- Step 4: Select your participant from the icons labelled with player initials.
- Step 5: Click **"View Profile"**
- The Hockey Canada ID number is located directly below the player's name (8-14 digits long).
